DECLARATION OF JORDAN LEE IN SUPPORT OF DV-100, REQUEST FOR DOMESTIC
VIOLENCE RESTRAINING ORDER

I, Jordan Lee, attest under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the following is true and correct.

Brief Relationship History

Respondent, Casey Morgan, is my former dating partner. I am 27 years old and Respondent is 29 years old. We were in a dating relationship from around June 2022 until February 2025. At first, Respondent was kind and attentive, but over time Respondent became increasingly jealous, controlling, and aggressive, especially when I spent time with friends or family. After our relationship ended, Respondent's behavior escalated into unwanted contact, threats, and uninvited appearances at my home and workplace. Because of this pattern, I fear for my safety and worry that Respondent will continue to harass, intimidate, or physically harm me if a restraining order is not issued.

Respondent has done the following:

- Shoved and physically restrained me during arguments so I could not leave
- Showed up uninvited at my home, forced their way inside, and damaged my property
- Sent repeated harassing text messages and social media messages, including statements that made me fear for my safety
- Appeared at my workplace without permission and caused a scene in front of my coworkers and customers
- Ignored my requests to stop contacting me and to stay away from my home and job

Most Recent Incidents of Abuse

October 2025:

In October 2025, at around 9:30 p.m., I was at my apartment in Los Angeles, California. Respondent and I had been broken up for about eight months. I was at home alone when Respondent came to my door without my permission. I had previously told Respondent by text not to come to my home. When I opened the door a few inches to see who it was, Respondent pushed the door open the rest of the way, walked inside, and started yelling at me about photos I had posted on Instagram with a friend. Respondent called me insulting names and accused me of cheating when we were together. Respondent stood very close to me, clenching their fists and blocking the doorway. When I said I was going to call

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the police, Respondent grabbed my phone out of my hand and threw it against the wall, cracking the case and shattering the screen (see Exhibit A). I felt scared that Respondent was going to hit me. I was able to get past Respondent and run to my neighbor's unit across the hall. My neighbor let me inside. From my neighbor's apartment, I heard Respondent pounding on my door and yelling for several minutes before finally leaving. I called 911 from my neighbor's phone. Police came, took a report (Exhibit B), and photographed my damaged phone. Respondent left before the officers arrived.

May 2025:

In May 2025, Respondent came to my workplace, a coffee shop in Torrance, without warning. Respondent stood in line and stared at me for several minutes. When Respondent reached the counter, Respondent began loudly questioning me in front of customers and coworkers about why I had blocked their number and social media accounts. Respondent raised their voice and accused me of trying to "ruin" their life. My manager asked Respondent to leave. After Respondent left, I was shaking and crying, and my manager documented what happened in case we needed it in the future.

Other Incidents:

Respondent has a pattern of harassing and intimidating behavior. In January 2025, while we were still dating, we argued at my apartment after a party. When I told Respondent I wanted to end the relationship, Respondent grabbed my wrists tightly with both hands and pushed me back onto the couch so I could not walk away. Respondent then stood in front of the apartment door, blocking it and refusing to let me leave for about twenty to thirty minutes while continuing to yell at me. My wrists were sore and red afterward, but I did not call the police because I felt embarrassed and scared it would make things worse.

After I ended the relationship in February 2025, Respondent began sending many text messages and direct messages almost every day. Some messages (see Exhibit C) included statements like "You'll regret this," "Don't think you're safe just because we're broken up," and "I know where you live." I blocked Respondent's phone number and social media accounts several times, but Respondent created new accounts to continue contacting me. Because of this ongoing pattern, I am constantly on edge and afraid Respondent will show up where I live or work.

Conclusion:

I am seeking to protect myself because I am increasingly fearful that Respondent will continue to harass me, damage my property, or physically harm me. Respondent's behavior has continued even after I ended our relationship and clearly asked Respondent to leave me alone. As such, I am respectfully requesting a 5-year restraining order to prevent Respondent from contacting me in any way and to keep Respondent away from my home, my workplace, and my vehicle, so that I can feel safe and begin to move forward with my life.

On October 16, 2025, at approximately 9:30 p.m., officers responded to a 911 call reporting a domestic disturbance at an apartment complex located in Los Angeles, California.

The victim reported that the respondent, her former dating partner, came to her apartment without permission. The victim stated that she and the respondent had been broken up for approximately eight months and that she had previously instructed the respondent by text message not to come to her home.

According to the victim, when she partially opened the door to see who was outside, the respondent pushed the door open the rest of the way and entered the apartment without consent. Once inside, the respondent began yelling at the victim about photographs she had posted on Instagram with a friend. The respondent called the victim insulting names and accused her of being unfaithful during their past relationship.

The victim stated that the respondent stood very close to her, clenched his fists, and blocked the doorway, preventing her from leaving. The victim reported that she felt scared and believed the respondent might hit her. When the victim stated that she was going to call the police, the respondent forcibly grabbed the victim's cellphone from her hand and threw it against the wall, causing the phone's screen to shatter and the case to crack.

The victim reported that she was able to get past the respondent and run to a neighbor's apartment across the hall. The neighbor allowed the victim to enter their unit. From inside the neighbor's apartment, the victim stated that she could hear the respondent pounding on her door and yelling in the hallway for several minutes before leaving the location.

The victim called 911 from the neighbor's phone. Officers arrived on scene and spoke with the victim in the neighbor's apartment. The respondent was no longer present when officers arrived. Officers observed the victim's cellphone, which had visible damage consistent with the victim's statement. Photographs of the damaged phone were taken.

The victim stated that she was afraid the respondent was going to hit her. The case remains under investigation.
